**HIV+ Women**

<i>Data</i>	<i>Category of Prevention Needs</i>	<i>Interventions</i>
Challenge to tell sex partners, family and friends their status. They worry about telling their partner because it may result in loss of partner or opportunity to have sex.	Persuasion	<b>*Same as those listed above for all HIV+ persons</b>

**Overarching issues to be addressed in interventions:**

- Include an anti-stigma component
- Provide access to opportunities to socialize with other persons living with HIV
- Expansion of skills building workshops for populations other than HIV+ MSM
